China is the earliest known civilization to work with cast iron, appearing in artifacts made thousands of years ago during the illustrious Zhou dynasty. Expanding upon techniques perfected long ago, the Shanxi province craftsman who made this 19th-century cast iron tub lavishly decorated it with floral patterns in low relief. Each side of the basin bears a different auspicious flower symbolic of the four seasons: the peony for spring, plum blossom for winter, lotus for summer, and chrysanthemum for autumn. Continued...
