This late 19th century footed celadon bowl is part of a large collection we acquired from a friend in Beijing. It would have been offered in Central Asia by Chinese traders along the silk road in exchange for spices or gems. The Chinese artisans who hand painted it with scrolls, loops and crossed lines thought the decorations looked similar to Islamic characters that they didn't know how to write.
